EXCITING NEWS FOR MENTAL HEALTH!



The Yuma County Education Service Agency has been awarded a \$45,000 grant to help support training about student and adult mental health. This grant from the Blue Cross Blue Shield of Arizona Foundation for Community and Health Advancement, will allow us to create a cohort of 20 educators for a quarterly targeted training, along with a substantial stipend for participation.

Trainings will range from a focus on wellness for adults in education, to Zones of Regulation, to anxiety, and finally building bridges of support. All training will be provided by expert professionals rather than Yuma County ESA staff.

This program will be held on Saturdays, and trained individuals will be tasked with sharing knowledge with the rest of their staff. If you are interested in participating or have questions, please contact Eliana.Osborn@azed.gov as soon as possible.





The Yuma County Education Service Agency was awarded \$5,600 to bring graphic artist and author Jose Pimienta to six area schools. Mr. Pimienta grew up in Mexicali, just 50 miles from Yuma, and has written a middle grade graphic novel about twins living on different sides of the border.

Mr. Pimienta will lead a workshop called "Tell Your Story," talking to students about his personal experiences and road to a publishing career. He'll work with sixth graders to brainstorm and begin creating their narratives in a graphic format.

Yuma Main Library will host a community event on Monday September 9. Mr. Pimienta will visit Mohawk Valley, Wellton, Rio Colorado, Orange Grove, and Encanto Elementary Schools.

AZ Reads is a program of Arizona Humanities focused on launching innovative and engaging literacy initiatives in K-12 schools in the state.

FOCUS ON SCIENCE

You may have seen Yuma County's state science scores—they are well ahead of the curve in 5th grade but that's where the good news ends. Rather than focus on the negative, we're working to bring high quality science education resources to the community.

First, July 15 is a full day session with the Arizona Science Center about Inquiry and the Engineering Design Process. In late August, SARSEF with be here for two days. There will be three training sessions at different sites, as well as a community night at Centennial Middle School. These SARSEF events will be science fair focused, including work on integrating Arizona Science Standards, running a fair, and doing class projects.

n September we are excited to hold our first Yuma based cohort of the STaR program from Arizona Science Center.




This is an intensive project taking place over two consecutive weekends where participants will receive \$500 and another \$500 in class supplies.

Finally, Arizona Game and Fish will be presenting a workshop called Building Literacy Through Wildlife. We hope this will be the first step in ongoing work with the organization.

We look forward to growing our educators so they are more confident and skilled teaching science concepts.

GET SET FOR STEM!

The Arizona Department of Education wants to help teachers "Get SET for STEM!" Our Scholarships for Effective Teachers program offers Arizona educators \$2,000 per year for up to three years to pursue coursework or programs that will:

- 1. Prepare them to add a STEM area (calculus, physics, biology, etc.) or CTE Certificate, **and**
- 2. Bolster their STEM teaching knowledge & skills

What's an Applicant's Commitment? Scholarship recipients agree to teach in Arizona public schools for three years after completing their coursework or program.

How often are scholarships awarded? Applications are accepted year-round and scholarships and awarded on a rolling basis. Applications must be submitted prior to enrollment in a program or coursework. Funding is awarded directly to the recipient after submitting paperwork that proves you have enrolled & paid for a course or program.
