15% MAINTENANCE AND OPERATION BUDGET OVERRIDE

**A STATEMENT AS TO WHY THE 15% MAINTENANCE
AND OPERATION BUDGET OVERRIDE ELECTION
HAS BEEN CALLED**

The Governing Board of the District has called a special budget override election to be held on November 5, 2024 to request voter authorization to exceed the Maintenance and Operation Budget Limit by 15% of the revenue control limit to fund existing programs, such budget override to be in effect for a period of seven years. The override authorized by this election shall be funded from a levy of taxes on the taxable property within the District.

The estimated cost to an owner of a home with a limited property value of \$79,260 (the average value of a home in the District) would be approximately \$33 per year.

The proposed override monies (\$411,399) are expected to fund the programs listed below in the first year the budget override will be in effect. Additionally, the override enhances the financial flexibility of the District and affords the opportunity to repay debt more quickly.

- Curriculum enhancements
- Teacher salary increase
- Facilities repairs and improvements

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SAMPLE BALLOT

PROPOSITION NO. 426

Shall the Governing Board of Antelope Union High School District No. 50 of Yuma County, Arizona (the "District"), adopt a General Maintenance and Operation Budget that includes an amount that exceeds the revenue control limit specified by statute by 15% for fiscal year 2025/2026 and for six subsequent years as described below?

The amount of the proposed increase of the proposed budget over the alternate budget for fiscal year 2025/2026 is estimated to be \$411,399. In fiscal years 2025/2026 through 2029/2030 the amount of the proposed increase will be 15% of the District's revenue control limit in each of such years, as provided in Section 15-481(P) of the Arizona Revised Statutes. In fiscal years 2030/2031 and 2031/2032, the amount of the proposed increase will be 10% and 5%, respectively, of the District's revenue control limit in each of such years, as provided in Section 15-481(P) of the Arizona Revised Statutes.

Any budget increase authorized by this election shall be entirely funded by a levy of taxes on the taxable property in this school district for the year for which adopted and for six (6) subsequent years, shall not be realized from monies furnished by the state and shall not be subject to the limitation on taxes specified in Article IX, Section 18, Constitution of Arizona. Based on the current net assessed valuation used for secondary property tax purposes, to fund the proposed increase in the school district's budget would require an estimated tax rate of \$0.42 per one hundred dollars of net assessed valuation used for secondary property tax purposes and is in addition to the school district's tax rate that will be levied to fund the school district's revenue control limit allowed by law.

A "no" vote shall not authorize the Antelope Union High School District Governing Board to adopt a maintenance and operation budget which includes an amount that exceeds its revenue control limit.

Requesting an Early Ballot

Voters who are not on the Active Early Voting List may request an early ballot be mailed to them up to 11 days before an election. Early ballots can be requested by phone, in writing or online at www.yumacountyaz.gov/voterandelectionservices.

Active Early Voting List

To be included on the Active Early Voting List (AEVL), eligible voters may submit either a preprinted form or a statement stating the request, which must include voter's name, residence address, mailing address (within AZ), date of birth and signature. The form can be printed from the County's website at www.yumacountyaz.gov.

Voter Assistance

The officer in charge of the election may appoint a special election board for making it possible for qualified electors who are ill or disabled to vote. Written or verbal requests for voter assistance must be sent to the Yuma County Recorder's Office. Requests must include the voter's name, residence address, date of birth, election for which the ballot is being requested, place of confinement and signature of the requester.

Last day to request assistance: Friday, November 1st, 2024

ELECTORS WHO VOTE IN PERSON ARE REQUIRED TO PRESENT IDENTIFICATION BEFORE RECEIVING A BALLOT.

1. List 1 – Photo ID with the Voter's Name and Address

Acceptable forms of identification with the voter's photograph, and name and address that reasonably match the voter's name and address in the signature roster or e-pollbook, include (only one required):

- A valid Arizona driver license;
- A valid Arizona non-operating identification license;
- A tribal enrollment card or other form of tribal identification; or
- Any other valid United States federal state, or local government-issued identification.

2. List 2 – Non-Photo ID with the Voter's Name and Address

A voter may present two separate documents that contain the voter's name and address. Acceptable forms of identification with the voter's name and address include the following:

- A utility bill for electric, gas, water, solid waste, sewer, telephone, cell phone, internet, or cable/satellite television service dated within 90 days of the election;
- A bank or credit union statement dated within 90 days of the election;
- A valid Arizona vehicle registration;
- A valid Indian or Native American census card;
- A property tax statement for the voter's residence;
- A valid tribal enrollment card or other valid form of tribal identification;
- A valid Arizona vehicle insurance card;
- A valid Recorder's Certificate;
- Any mailing marked "Official Election Material," including a valid Arizona voter registration card; or
- Any valid United States federal, state, or local government-issued identification.

A.R.S. § 16-579(A)(1)(b). Any List 2 document may be presented to a poll worker in electronic format, including on a smart phone or tablet.

3. List 3 – Acceptable Hybrid Forms of ID

The voter may present certain combinations of documents from Lists 1 and 2. Acceptable combinations include:

- A valid photo identification from List 1 with an address that does not reasonably match the voter's address in the signature roster or e-pollbook, accompanied by a document from List 2 with an address that does reasonably match the voter's address in the signature roster or e-pollbook;
- A valid U.S. Passport or passport card, accompanied by a document from List 2; or
- A valid U.S. Military identification, accompanied by a document from List 2.

If the elector does not provide identification as described, the elector shall be issued a provisional ballot. The elector must provide identification to the county recorder or to an official deemed acceptable by the county recorder per the instructions provided at the polling place in order for the provisional ballot to be processed and counted as follows:

- Una licencia de conducir válida de Arizona;
- Una licencia válida de identificación no operativa de Arizona;
- Una tarjeta de inscripción tribal u otra forma de identificación tribal; o
- Cualquier otra identificación válida emitida por el gobierno federal, estatal o local de los Estados Unidos.

2. Lista 2 - Identificación sin fotografía con el nombre y dirección de el votante

Un votante puede presentar dos documentos separados que contengan su nombre y la dirección. Las formas aceptables de identificación con el nombre y la dirección de el votante incluyen las siguientes:

- Una factura de servicios públicos de electricidad, gas, agua, residuos sólidos, alcantarillado, teléfono celular, internet o servicio de televisión por cable/satélite con fecha dentro de los 90 días posteriores a la elección;
- Un estado de cuenta del banco o cooperativa de crédito con fecha dentro de los 90 días posteriores de la elección;
- Un registro de vehículo válido de Arizona;
- Una tarjeta de censo indígena o nativo americano válida;
- Una declaración de impuestos sobre la propiedad de la residencia del votante;
- Una tarjeta de inscripción tribal válida u otra forma válida de identificación tribal;
- Una tarjeta de seguro de vehículo de Arizona válida;
- Un Certificado de Registro válido;
- Cualquier envío marcado «Material Electoral Oficial», incluyendo una tarjeta válida de registro de votante de Arizona; tarjeta de registro de votante de Arizona; o
- Cualquier identificación válida emitida por el gobierno federal, estatal o local de los Estados Unidos.

A.R.S. § 16-579(A)(1)(b). Cualquier documento de la Lista 2 puede presentarse a un trabajador electoral en formato electrónico, incluso en un teléfono inteligente o tableta.

3. Lista 3 - Formas híbridas de identificación aceptables

El elector podrá presentar determinadas combinaciones de documentos de las Listas 1 y 2. Las combinaciones aceptables incluyen:

- Una identificación válida con fotografía de la Lista 1 con una dirección que no coincide razonablemente con la dirección del votante en la lista de firmas o el libro electoral electrónico, acompañada de un documento de la Lista 2 con una dirección que coincide razonablemente con la dirección del votante en la lista de firmas o libro electoral electrónico;

- Un pasaporte o tarjeta de pasaporte de EE.UU. válidos, acompañados de un documento de la Lista 2; o
- Una identificación militar de EE.UU. válida, acompañada de un documento de la Lista 2.

Si el elector no presenta la identificación descrita, se le emitirá una papeleta provisional. El elector debe presentar su identificación al registrador del condado o a un funcionario considerado aceptable por el registrador del condado según las instrucciones proporcionadas en el centro de votación para que la papeleta provisional sea procesada y contada como se indica a continuación:
